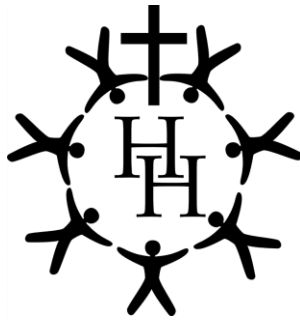

Please find below the results of our parent survey taken place in March 2018 (87 responses, due to rounding results may not equal 100%).

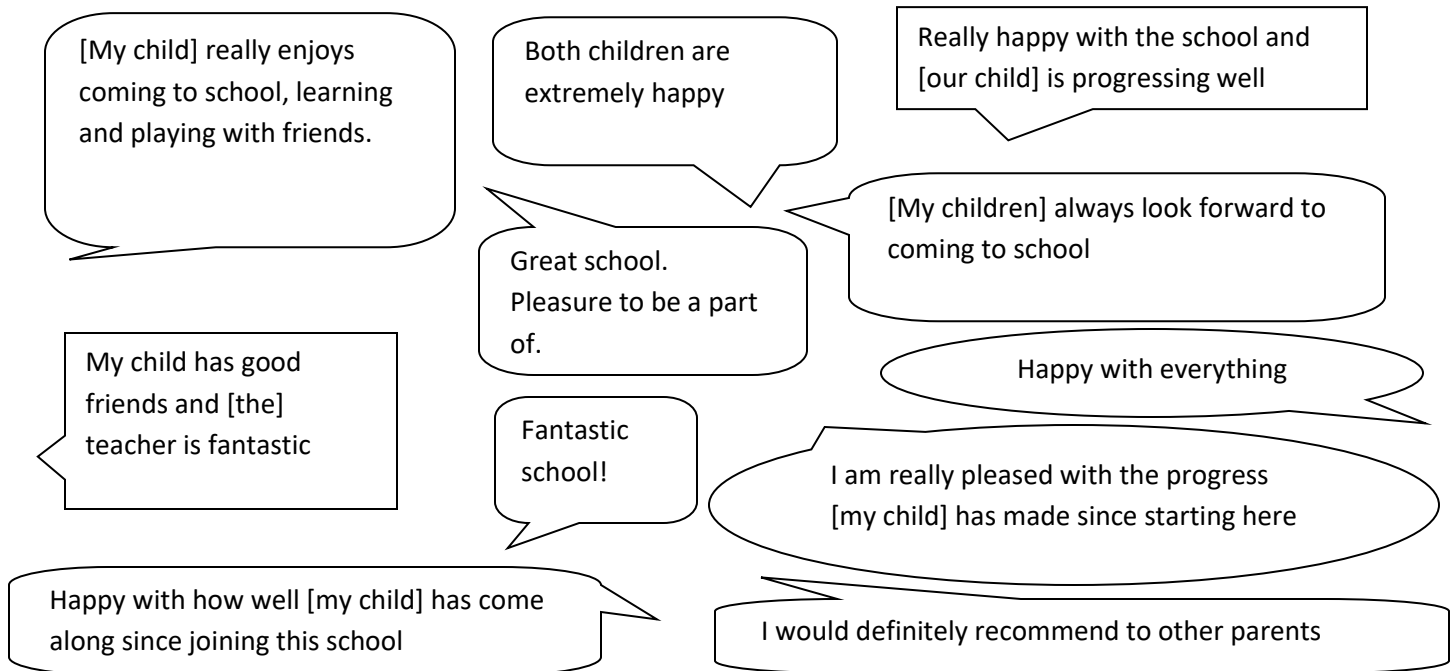

Costs for this are included in budget from April and hopefully this will allow us a better system.
More sports activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sainsbury's silver school games mark achieved</li> <li>• 2 hours of dedicated PE for all classes led by sports coaches funded through sports premium money</li> <li>• 3 hours of out of hours sports coaching available half termly</li> </ul>	Increased sports premium now means that we can fund staffing for more out of school competitions
