## Format of the School C Children will continue to enter school in their classes for registration. Classroom support will be Mrs Firth. Most morning activities will be focussed on literac and maths, which will include reading and SPAG work. There will also be additional time timetabled in for these subjects to make up for lost time. Afternoon activities will be topic work, art, Music, science, R.E., MFL, DT, ICT and PE.

9am – 9.30am. Early morning session to include guided reading, guided writing, maths games, handwriting practise and spellings. 9.30am – 10.30am Literacy.

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10.30am -10.45am Playtime for class \$ only

(0.45am - 11.45am Maths

11:45am - 12:30pm Additional maths and English

12:30pm- 1:15pm- Dinner time, Children will eat their meal in class and have some time outside.

1:15pm-1;30pm- collective worship will take place in classes

Structure of the atter Varies depending on each day but will include:

PE - I hour and half session a week led by sports specialists. PE will take place outside so it is essential that children have the right clothing and footwear. Initially there will be no swimming for year 4 children.

Science. Art/DT.

Topic - History/Geography.

PSHCE. RE. Music.

Work will be differentiated accordingly and be based around a different topic each half term. Children will receive a login for online reading books. We ask that all children aim to read at least 4 times a week.

- Maths homework which may be a practical game type of activity or ICT activity will be given out on a Thursday - to be completed by the following Thursday.
- English homework may have a SPAG focus, writing, research or comprehension. This will be given out on a Thursday - to be completed by the following Thursday.

ICT- Initially children will be given some e-safety homework to complete online. Spellings will be given out on a Tuesday for a spelling test the following Tuesday. Children will also be given a mental maths challenge on a Tuesday to be tested the following

We ask for children to aim to read at home at least 4 times a week. Children have received a sheet with reading challenge books appropriate to their age.

Children will be given a login to an online reading resource. Children will still be able to borrow books from school but these will need to be isolated when returned. Your child will have targets set for Maths, Writing, Reading and Attitude to learning each half term.

These will be agreed with your child following discussion at the start of each half term.

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These will be shared with yourselves, who will have opportunity to comment on and offer support at home.

Children and teachers will assess progress each half term and once again share details with parents.

## Behaviour

- Stage 1 Name recorded on board as a warning
- Stage 2 Mark recorded next to name on board as final warning
- Stage 3 Time out in class
- Stage 4 Time out in alternative class
- Stage 5 Time out at playtime with reflection sheet
- Stage 6 Time out at lunchtime
- Stage 7 Senior leader intervention (could result in parental engagement and/or exclusion)
