Practise them with your best writing – joined. Can you create a puzzle for your spellings? This could be a word search, crossword or even a code breaker.	Think of your favourite story. Can you rewrite the story making one change to the story or an alternative ending?	Thinking of your favourite story, can you write some Haiku poems about events or characters from the book? Remember the 5,7,5 syllable count. Draw any shape, a mirror line and reflect the shape.	Can you create your own dice? You will need to draw a net to create a cube. Remember the properties of a cube to help you draw the net. Then when you have done this draw the dots on, fold and stick together.	Complete activities on Mathletics- in particular position and direction.	Can you create your own maths board game? This could use a mixture of everything we have learnt in maths. Your game could be based on other games such as Monopoly or Cluedo, or it could be an entirely new game! You could even use the dice you created to play your game.
