Ask a grown up to write you some missing number sentences to complete e.g. 2 6 12 30 50 70 100	Doubling and halving numbers up to 20. Can you double all the numbers from 1-12? What is half of 2,4,6,8,10,12,14,16,18 and 20? Write down your answers.	Practise your mental maths challenge and ask your family to test you on it.
