Can you identify any important events in particular months? e.g. In December we celebrate Christmas	Draw yourself 8 clocks. Take care where you put the numbers 1 - 12. See example below. Here are 8 different times. Can you draw the hands on your clocks to show these times? Take care with your hour hand and minute hand. 2 o'clock, 4 o'clock, 9 o'clock, 11 o'clock. Half past 3, half past 6, half past 10, half past 12. 


