

English	Write a diary entry explaining what you did at the weekend. I am a fish. I have very sharp teeth. I have a fin. What am I?	Rhyming words Below is a list of words. How many words can you think of that rhyme with each individual word? Can you write a sentence that includes as many of your rhyming words as possible? See example below. Maths	Ask a grown up to help you get a 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2 (You could also add notes £5, £10 and £20) Or you could cut the coins out below. Discuss the value of each coin. Order the coins from the smallest value to biggest. Choose 2 coins. Which coin has the largest value? Explain to a grown up how you know. Repeat with different coins.	Write down an amount of money up to 30p such as 26p. How many different ways can you make 26p? e.g. 10p+10p+5p+1p= 26p 10p+5p+5p+2p+2p+2p= 26p	For this activity use 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p coins (If you want to challenge yourself add other coins) Take some of coins from the pile then ask a grown up to take some. Add up your pile then add up your grown up's pile. Who has the most? Who has the least? Which coins should you choose if you want to end up with the most money?	The answer is 20. How many different number sentences can you make with an answer of 20? 16 + 4 22 - 2 10 x 2 10+10	Practise your mental maths challenge and ask your family to test you on it. Keep chanting your 2x, 5x and 10x tables.
