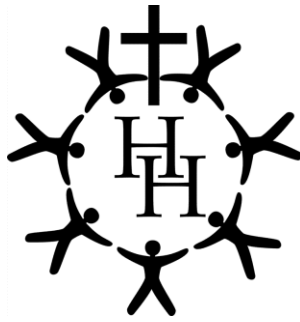

We all need to take responsibility for keeping our school community as safe as possible.

Covid-19 Update

Again, we have had no more cases in school and, whilst we have had people undertake tests due to potential symptoms, these have all been negative.

May I remind our families of the general key message from the Government this week of Hands, Face, Space.
HANDS - Washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (or using hand sanitizer where this is not possible) regularly throughout the day will reduce the risk of catching or passing on the virus.

FACE - Face coverings reduce the dispersion of these droplets, meaning if you're carrying the virus you're less likely to spread it when you exhale.

SPACE - Transmission of the virus is most likely to happen within 2 metres, with risk increasing exponentially at shorter distances.

Maintain a 2m distance from others outside your household. Within school we use a system of limiting contacts so that pods of children remain together and do not mix with others throughout the day to stay as safe as possible.
