- (b) The impairment has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on his orher ability to carry out normal day-to-dayactivities.

We understandthat the Local Authority will monitor the school's activity under the Equality Act 2010(and in particular Schedule 10 regarding Accessibility) and will advise upon the compliance with thatduty.

Objectives

Hanging Heaton C of E (VC) J & I School is committed to providing an environment thatenables full curriculum access that values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotionalandcultural needs. We are committed to taking positive action in the spirit of theEquality Act 2010 with regard to disability and to developing a culture of inclusion, support and awareness within theschool.

The school recognises and values parent's knowledge of their child's disability andits effect on their ability to carry out everyday activities and respects the parent'sand child's right toconfidentiality.

The Accessibility Plan contains relevant and timely actionsto:-
