

Curriculum Information for Parents

Class: 5

Term: Summer Term 2022



Learning

English	<p>We will begin the term with a unit on traditional tales and legends. Within this unit we will predict what might happen from details both stated and implied in the text. When writing our own narratives we will consider how authors develop characters and settings. We will then move on to look at discussion texts and debates. We will then look at poetry which includes figurative language. We will develop our use of descriptive vocabulary and will consider the effect of this on the reader. We will perform our own compositions using appropriate intonation, volume, and movements so the meaning is clear. After this we will complete a unit on classic fiction during which we will distinguish between the language of speech and writing, choosing the appropriate register. We will also look at formal reports and radio/tv broadcasts before finally completing another narrative unit which will be science fiction.</p>
Mathematics	<p>We will begin this term with some maths revision work in preparation for the upcoming SAT's tests. We will practise and consolidate both the written methods for long multiplication and long division. We will look again at the addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of fractions along with work on common denominators, multiples and factors. We will also recap our work on fractions, decimals, percentages and the equivalence between these.</p> <p>We will then move on to some work on statistics. We will learn about line graphs and how to interpret these. We will draw our own line graphs for given data. We will also look at interpreting data in pie charts and will link this to percentages. We will then move on to learn about averages, and how to calculate the mean average. Finally, we will move on to shape and geometry where we will learn about the properties of different shapes. We will also learn about different types of angles and will practise drawing these accurately with protractors.</p>
Our Topic this term is: Enterprise!	
Science	Our science topic this half term is Electricity.
Topic and Creative	We will be working on an enterprise project this half term. We will be producing some goods to sell at our school Jubilee celebration on 26 th May...watch this space!
RE	In RE we will learn about how Sikhs show commitment. We will then move on to learn about how people express their ideas about God.
PE	This term we will be focusing on cricket and our athletic skills. We will also be completing 'Sporting Age'
PSHE	In our PSHE units we will learn about economic wellbeing. We will also complete some transition work to help the children with their move to high school.
Computing	This term we will be looking at Data and Information using spreadsheets. Later on in the term, we will focus on Programming.
Music	Our music units this term will be 'Class Awards' and 'Moving On'.
French	This term we will be revising days of the week and looking at vocabulary associated with holidays.
Art	We will learn and apply new drawing techniques associated with the Queen.

You can help at home by:-

Encouraging your child to read regularly and practise spellings. Talk about the spelling words with your child to help with their understanding and to broaden their vocabulary knowledge.
